


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

PROCESSES AND PROCEDURES

School Timings and Punctuality:

School Working Days Monday-Friday (for students)

(5-day week)

School Timing Junior Wing (Buds to Class II)

09:00 a.m. to 01:00 p.m.

Senior Wing (Class III to Class XII)

08:00 a.m. to 02:30 p.m.

Success has never been achieved without punctuality. Hence the school timings must be adhered to strictly.

Morning Timings:

- All students of Junior Wing should be in by 08:50 a.m. Gate No. 1 and 2 are closed at 09:00 a.m. followed by late entry through Gate No. 3 within 09:10 a.m. On three consecutive late entries, the student is sent back home. No student is permitted to enter after 09:10 a.m.
- Similar time slots are followed for the Senior Wing where all gates will be closed and no student is permitted to enter after 08:10 a.m.

Afternoon Dispersal:

- Parents of walkers can be at Gate No. 2 at 01:00 p.m. for Classes Buds II and at Gate No. 3 at 02:30 p.m., for Classes III V to collect their wards. Dispersal of walkers of classes VI -XII takes place from Gate No. 1.
- Students who are escorted home either by a parent/guardian/van driver are allowed to be picked up only if the escort carries the Parent's I -Card.
- All parents who avail transport of private vans must ensure that the police verification certificate of the driver is deposited at the school office.
- No student is allowed to leave the school before dispersal time unless there is a medical emergency.

All measures are to ensure the complete safety and security of each and every student. We look forward to complete cooperation from the parents in this regard.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

To ensure a feeling of belongingness and oneness amongst students, uniform rules are strictly adhered to. The school uniform provides identification, instils discipline and maintains school identity and spirit. All students are expected to proudly wear the correct uniform to school on all working days. The uniform can be procured from the school uniform store which functions on all working days between 08:30 a.m. and 03:00 p.m.

UNIFORM TURNOUT

- 1. Students are expected to wear the correct school uniform neatly and are not to wear items that deviate from the uniform listed in the Almanac.
- 2. All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the child's full name.
- 3. Shoes can be marked on the inside with a waterproof marker.
- 4. Identity cards must be worn at all times.
- 5. Children should wear clean black school shoes on all days except when they have games/ PE periods. On such days white shoes should be worn.

Girl Students must

- Wear only one small stud or small earrings.
- Girls who have very short hair are allowed to wear their hair loose, but pinned up. Other girls with shoulder-length hair should tie them back, away from the face, to allow clear vision.
- Ribbons and bands should be in school colours (yellow for junior classes and Navy blue for seniors).

Girl Students Are Not Permitted To

- Have streaked hair, fancy hairstyles, leave shoulder length or long hair untied.
- Get layered haircut for girls which make them look unkempt.
- Wear eye makeup or any other kind of make up during school hours.
- Wear gold earrings, bangles, chains, colourful and fancy jewellery, long or hanging earrings.
- Adorn their hair with flowers or colourful clips.
- Use nail paints or apply henna.

Boy Students Are Not Permitted To

- Wear caps and headgear to school.
- Have streaked hair, long hair, long side burns or fancy hairstyles.
- Wear bracelets/chains/ friendship bands or other bands.

Class teachers / PE teachers are responsible for maintaining and checking that the correct school uniform is worn. Uniform defaulter registers are maintained and parents are regularly informed about it. In case of defaulting repeatedly, strict disciplinary action may be taken.

LEARNING AT SGS

The facilitation of learning at SGS has a few features:

- Interactive -Moving away from the one-way instructional strategy, the students are made to participate in diverse activities like role plays and enactments to ensure indepth learning.
- **Experiential**-The thrust of teaching is towards making each student undergo the experiential cycle of getting an experience, reflecting on it, brainstorming on the reasons and thus taking a never-to-fade learning of a concept or an idea.
- **Differential** The teaching-learning process is designed to ensure that students are imparted knowledge in a variety of ways, to ensure that each is able to receive and retrieve information according to his/her unique multiple intelligence strengths.
- **Hands-On**-Doing is an integral part of learning and the students are made to use the plethora of labs for this purpose.
- Scientific-Sequential, logical and Analytical; the instructional strategies aim at creating a scientific bent of mind, be it in fast and accurate solving of arithmetic problems by the Abacus (for classes LKG to II) or by the ancient tools of Vedic mathematics (for classes III-X); or in the use of the Marion Richardson Script which does away with the complex loops and curves of the cursive script.
- Project Based (PBIL) -The skills of planning, organising, teaming and tasking are inculcated in each student from a very early age by having various kinds of projects integrated in the curriculum.
- Value Based (VBIL) -Keeping our students rooted to the richness of Indian beliefs and values is achieved by regular value education classes. The school is blessed with patronage by The Ramakrishna Mission which runs regular programmes of Inner Awakening with the students.
- Theatre in Education (TIE) -Be it the active, interactive, theme based story telling sessions in the pre-primary and primary classes; or the skills of dramatics used in street plays, mimes, one-act plays etc in the middle and senior sections; the curriculum is centred around portraying important social messages through the art of theatre.
- Art in Education (AIE) -The walls of SGS are dotted with posters, placards, collages
 and wall magazines, created by students, bringing forth sharp, stark messages to the
 community at large.

HOME WORK POLICY

- Revisiting the lessons learnt is a must for effective retention and reproduction. Keeping with this thought, home work is structured to attain optimal learning.
- Depending on the academic level of students, home work may either be practice of content or skills learnt in class; or an exercise to provoke thought and direct the mind towards a particular theme/ concept.
- Parents are intimated about the homework through the school almanac and are expected to ensure its completion. They should aim at motivating their ward in understanding the importance of revision and must refrain from completing the assignments themselves.

ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION

The teaching -learning process is considered incomplete without an effective Evaluation. According to the National Curriculum Framework (NCF), the most authentic and effective evaluation must be

- Regular and distributed throughout the year and not time bound. It must happen
 during the forming stages of learning leading to the identification of learning gaps
 and having scope for remedial action.
- Assessment of holistic development of the learner should encompass cognitive, affective and psychomotor domains.
- Evaluation must include the use of a variety of tools and techniques and must be unambiguous, scientific, and analytical.

Evaluation at SGS is in accordance with the above mentioned concept and includes the assessment of both scholastic and co- scholastic aspects of a pupil's learning. Life Skills, Attitudes and Values; as well as Physical Fitness of the student is also assessed and reported.

Pre School (Buds) - Pre Primary (Blooms)

The academic year is divided into two terms. There are no formal examinations for these classes. Individual and Collaborative activities and competitions are graded and the cumulative record of the entire term is discussed with the parents during the PTM at the end of each Term.

Classes I - II

The academic year is divided into three cycles. Evaluation of the child's progress is done on the basis of continuous theme-based assessments, which include reading, recitation, storytelling, creative works etc. One pen-paper test is held every week which sums up to two of each subject in each Cycle. Progress Reports are shared with the parents during the PTM at the end of each cycle.

Classes III - V

Three cycles in each academic year with detailed grading on various parameters of each subject along with two unit tests per subject per cycle make up the cumulative grading of each Cycle. The unit tests are scheduled as one per week. The progress of the student is shared with the parent at the end of each cycle.

Equal emphasis is laid on acquisition of life skills, attitude and values, interests and achievement in co-curricular activities, including sports and games. These are also continuously evaluated through activities in which students are encouraged to participate.

Classes VI-VIII

The academic year will be divided into two terms- Term I and II. The assessment will be done in both scholastic and co-scholastic aspects. Scholastic aspects will include subject specific areas whereas co-scholastic aspects will include life skills, co-curricular activities, discipline, attitudes and values; for the holistic development of the student.

1. Scholastic Area:

Each term will have one cycle of each of the following

- a. Periodic Test (PT) –conducted in a test cycle spread over the term -10%
- b. Subject Enrichment Activity –aimed at enrichment, understanding and skill development in subject specific areas-5%
- c. Notebook Submission, Assignments and Neatness- 5%
- d. Term End Examination-80 Marks

The total of each term will thus be 100 Marks.

The syllabus weightage for annual examination will be 60%, 70% & 80% of the whole course in classes VI, VII & VIII respectively.

2. Co-Scholastic Activities:

Will be graded on a three point grading scale and will include

- a. Work Education
- b. Art Education
- c. Health and Physical Education
- d. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour & Values)

Class IX-X

The assessment will be done in both scholastic and co-scholastic aspects. Scholastic aspects will include subject specific areas whereas co-scholastic aspects will include life skills, co-curricular activities, discipline, attitudes and values; for the holistic development of the student.

A Pre-board examination will be administered in class X to give the students practice in taking examinations of the whole course as per the board pattern. The number of papers and marks for each will be the same as in the Board Examination.

- d. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values)

Classes XI -XII

The year will be divided into two terms for class XI and three terms for class XII. Unit tests and term Examinations will be conducted in each term. Mock/Pre-board examination will be administered in class XII to give the students practice in taking examinations of the whole course as per the board pattern. The number of papers and marks for each will be the same as in the Board Examination.

Eligibility / Attendance Requirements

No student is generally eligible to appear in the Annual Assessment / Examination who has not put in at least 75% of attendance during the session as per the school calendar.

Promotion Criteria

- a. Promotion cannot be claimed as a matter of right but will be awarded on the basis of the cumulative results of periodic tests, subject enrichment activities and the term end examination.
- b. A student will have to secure 40% marks in each subject to qualify for promotion to the next higher class, except Classes X and XII where promotion will be granted by the CBSE.
- c. The decision of the school authorities regarding promotion will be final and binding on the parents/ guardians.
- d. No student will be given double promotion.

Students of Pre School to Class II attend most of the above mentioned activities. Class III onwards, each student opts for any one club from each category of scholastic and co scholastic, based on eligibility criteria and his/her personal preference.

Students regularly participate in Intra School and Inter School events and competitions, showcasing the skills and talent acquired through these clubs. The huge numbers of accolades and honours gained regularly by the school is testimony to the high standards of performance in each of these fields

ENSURING PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT

Thematic Assemblies

Morning assemblies form an integral part of the curriculum and are observed on themes which are planned at the beginning of the session. Values, Festivals and Days of national and international importance are celebrated through these assemblies, ensuring the development of intrapersonal, interpersonal and social skills.

House System:

In an endeavour towards grooming of students to inculcate the qualities of confidence, team spirit and healthy competitiveness, the entire school community from class III onwards is divided into four houses, which are named on the qualities that the school wishes to develop in each student. The four houses are:

- Harmony
- Glory
- Peace
- Pride

Each House has a House Warden to guide the students in various Inter House competitions and activities conducted throughout the session. The Inter House Rolling Trophy is awarded to the Winner House at the end of each academic session.

Camps, Excursions and Trips:

Adventure Camps and educational trips planned as part of the annual calendar help students to explore, appreciate and connect with nature; strengthening the bonds of interdependence and enthusing the tenets of preservation and conservation. Regular trips to museums and galleries aid in increasing knowledge and developing appreciation.

Green Initiatives:

SGS is committed towards nurturing environment and preserving it for future generations. The students are sensitized to this pressing need of the hour through various projects, surveys, dramas, street plays, demonstrations and rallies which are also community outreach programmes. The school has won numerous accolades for its path breaking contribution towards the Green Earth Campaign.

Social Initiatives:

Creating sensitive, compassionate and caring citizens of tomorrow is a need in this fast paced practical world. Not only students, but also their families are motivated towards community service. Numerous donations, charity shows and presentations are made towards the cause of the less fortunate ones of the society.

Seminars, Symposia and Workshops:

A variety of skills, attitudes and values as well as important information is disseminated to the students through a comprehensive program of talks, seminars and workshops. Students are sent out to attend the same at out of school locations as well. A rigorous calendar of in-service training for the teachers ensures their skill building and keeps them abreast with latest trends in education and pedagogy.

COMMUNICATION WITH PARENTS

1. School Website

The school website (www.SachdevaGlobal.in) is an important and an effective medium to get the latest updates about the school activities along with photographs and videos. Parents are requested to browse the site regularly to know about all the happenings of the school, important circulars, accolades gained and events organized.

2. Almanac


- The Almanac is a means for the parent to communicate effectively with the school.
 Parents may use the ruled pages whenever they wish to communicate with the teacher. Parents must go through their child's almanac every day.
- They must countersign all communication after reading them.
- Circulars from school are sent in the Almanac (and are also updated on the website).
 Parents must read the circulars, remove them from the almanac and file them for future use.

3. SMS

• SMSs are sent regularly by the school to the mobile numbers of parents. In case SMSs are not being received, parents must check with the school office. They must also ensure that the latest mobile numbers are updated in the school records.

4. Parent Teacher Interaction

To build up healthy communication and a close rapport between parents and teachers, Parent Teacher Interactions are held on a regular basis. Prior circulars and SMSs are sent for information regarding dates.





CHILD PROTECTION PROCEDURE

Ensuring safety and security of our students is our topmost priority. The following systems have been devised for the same.

I. Identity Cards

The students of SGS are issued a set of two Identity Cards – Blue (for the student) and Red (for the Parent). The student must wear the student I-card everyday to school. A student will be handed over to the Parent/Guardian/Van Driver only if the Parent's I-card is carried by them.

II. Visitor's Badges

All visitors must sign in at the gate and then report to the reception. At the gate, they must collect a visitor's badge which must be worn by them in the school campus. The visitor's badge must be returned to the Guards at the school gate when the visitor exits.

III. Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) Cameras

CCTV surveillance systems in the school are a way of ensuring a safe, secure and healthy learning environment for children. CCTV cameras are of great help to monitor the movement of people visiting the school. The entire school building is under the surveillance of CCTV cameras.

IV. Provision of First and Fast Aid

Although the school takes all measures and precautions to ensure the physical safety of the students, a well-equipped medical centre and a trained nurse is available to ensure first and fast relief in case of any emergency. Depending on the crisis, the student may be taken to the nearest multi-speciality hospital for appropriate medical attention. Parents must fill the medical information form provided in the Almanac at the beginning of every session to facilitate timely action.

V. Emergency Procedures

In the event of any emergency a continuous alarm is sounded. Teachers along with their classes vacate the classrooms as per evacuation routes already planned and put up on the School Notice Boards. Regular Mock Evacuation Drills are conducted to keep the students aware of the systems.

VI. GPS Access

At SGS, we have GPS vehicle tracking systems installed in all the school buses. Such a system helps in ensuring the safety, better management, control and monitoring along with the other necessary checks. The school and the parents can monitor the location of the school buses by simply sending an SMS.

SCHOOL RULES

Attendance Rules

- No student who has been absent on the previous day will be allowed to attend unless his/her parent has entered an explanation stating the reasons for the absence, in the 'Record of Non-Attendance' section of the Almanac, for each day the student has been absent from school. It is the responsibility of absentee students to ensure that their parents have entered the relevant information and signed the Almanac, failing which; the student's parents may be called to school and asked to take their ward back home.
- In case of absence of more than three days on Medical Grounds, Medical Certificate & prescription must be attached along with application.
- There is no provision for half day leave. Hence students who are not well should not be sent to school even on exam/test days.
- A student, returning to school after suffering an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a doctor's fitness certificate permitting him/her to attend school.
 Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to school:

Chicken Pox Till the scabs fall completely (Not > 15 Days)

Cholera Till the child has completely recovered (Not > 15 Days)
Measles Two weeks after the rash disappears (Not > 10 Days)

Mumps Until the swelling has gone (Not > 15 Days)
Whooping Cough
Hepatitis Till the doctor certifies (Not > 20 Days)
Till the doctor certifies (Not > 20 Days)

- Repeated absence without notice or unexplained absence without written application for more than six consecutive days renders the student liable to have her/his name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may only be granted after payment of a re-admission fee.
- All students are expected to attend school on the opening day immediately following the vacations. Absence on the day of reopening of the school will attract strict disciplinary action.
- It is compulsory for students to achieve 75% attendance in each term in order to be eligible to take the end-of-term assessment. This stipulation can only be relaxed on genuine medical grounds, at the sole discretion of the Principal. Even on medical grounds, a student cannot remain absent for more than 25% of total working days. It is mandatory for all students, unless instructed otherwise to be present for festivals and functions celebrated in and outside the school.

Discipline Rules

- Every student must carry the Almanac every day and use it productively.
- Students are not allowed to bring any weapons or sharp instruments, such as blades, knives, paper-scalpels, scissors etc., to school.
- Damaging or disfiguring any school property may result in expulsion from school.
- Students are prohibited from bringing any publication, reference books, CD or other storage devices like floppies, pen drives or I-pods, not relevant to academic pursuits.
- Bringing mobile phones, cameras, expensive pens, pencils, pencil box, etc., to school is strictly forbidden.
- Students are not allowed to ride scooters or motorcycles to school.
- Unless asked for, bringing money to school in access of INR 30 to 50 is not allowed.
- In the interest of their own security, students are advised not to buy or receive any articles, gifts or foodstuffs from anyone en route.
- Exploding crackers on any occasion or splashing colours during Holi in the school premises or in school buses is strictly forbidden.
- Bullying and the use of foul language are punishable offences, whether in or out of school. Students found using the same may be expelled.
- The school is committed to protecting the environment and expects its students to be environment friendly in all their actions. The use of polybags (plastic bags) is, therefore, strictly prohibited in the school and students should consciously avoid their use for any purpose.
- Students are not allowed to celebrate their birthdays or any other occasion in the school by wearing any clothes other than the school uniform. They are allowed to distribute only candies as a celebratory gesture. Distribution of gifts is strictly prohibited.
- It is mandatory for all students to use the campus language of English at all times except during classes of other languages.
- Students must always exhibit respect for faculty members and mutual respect for peers.

Uniform Rules

All students are expected to proudly wear the correct uniform to school on all working days. Defaulting in the same may lead to strict disciplinary action.

Fee Payment Rules

- The school fees are to be paid regularly through cheque, on a monthly / quarterly basis. The cheque can be dropped in the Drop Box at the school Gates No. 1 and 2.
- The fee for each month is to be deposited by the 10th of the month. If the same happens to be a holiday, then the payment should be made by the 9th of the month.
- Fee deposited after the due date will entail an additional fine on a daily basis.
- If the school fee is not paid by the end of the month, the school will be forced to strike off the name of the child from the school roll and re-admission will be at the discretion of the Head of the School and a payment of the re-admission fee.

Transport Rules

- All students using the school bus are expected to be at the bus stop, at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
- The routes of the school buses are pre-planned and parents should consult the Transport In charge for necessary details. The driver is authorized to stop buses at the designated stops only.
- All students must occupy seats immediately after boarding their buses. Students
 must not move around inside the bus and no part of their body should be outside the
 bus.
- A Teacher In charge/maid, in addition to the helper, is there in each bus with the children. Any problems faced by a student must be brought to the notice of the Teacher In charge and the Head of the School immediately.
- Parents must not board the school bus at any time.
- No student will be allowed to board a different route to fulfil social engagements.

Withdrawal Rules

- In case a parent is desirous of withdrawing a pupil from the school, a written application must be forwarded to the Head of the School, one calendar month in advance.
- In case a notice period of one month is not rendered, the fee for a month is charged.
- Transfer certificate is issued only after all the dues of the school are settled.




NARAYAN MURTHY

Nagavara Ramarao Narayana Murthy was born on 20th august, 1946 in the Kolar District of Karnataka, India. He studied electrical engineering at the National Institute of Engineering, Mysore. In 1969, after completing his graduation, he left for London where he worked in a company called SESA. In 1981, a new chapter began in his life when he, along with Six other software professionals, started a company called Infosys. His father used to work for a lesser known IT firm named Patni Computer Systems and when Murthy started out to set up Infosys, he had nothing but his wife's saving of INR 10,000. His company's total asset value is over 10.5 billion dollars. From being a leader with a clear vision who has taken a small enterprise to making it establish a strong hold on the international market, today Infosys has 3 billion dollars in revenue, 70,000 employees and over 500 customers. After taking Infosys to such heights, he retired in 2011. Everyone knows Narayana Murthy as the one who made Infosys what it is today. More than his management and strategic implementations, it was the values that he stood for that helped him and his company reach where they are today.

STEVE JOBS

Steven Paul "Steve" Jobs (February 24, 1955 – October 5, 2011) was an American businessman, inventor, and industrial designer. He was the co-founder, chairman, and chief executive officer (CEO) of Apple Inc.; CEO and majority shareholder of Pixar; a member of The Walt Disney Company's board of directors following its acquisition of Pixar; and founder, chairman, and CEO of NeXT. Jobs was adopted at birth in San Francisco, and raised in the San Francisco Bay Area during the 1960s. Jobs briefly attended Reed College in 1972 before dropping out and is known to have visited India subsequently. He visited the Neem Karoli Baba, Nainital, Uttrakhand in search of spiritual enlightenment and also apparently spent lot of time in Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Himachal Pradesh. As a child, he showed an early interest in electronics and gadgetry. He spent a lot of time working in the garage workshop of a neighbor who worked at Hewlett-Packard, an electronics manufacturer. Jobs co-founded Apple in 1976 to sell Wozniak's Apple I personal computer. Jobs was diagnosed with a pancreatic neuroendocrine tumor in 2003 and died of respiratory arrest related to the tumor on October 5, 2011.




DHIRUBHAI AMBANI

Dhirajlal Hirachand "Dhirubhai" Ambani (28 December 1932 – 6 July 2002), better known as Dhirubhai Ambani, was one of India's greatest visionaries and iconic business tycoons. He was the founder of Reliance Industries Limited (established in 1966) and contributed greatly to the company's meteoric rise. Dhirubhai's rags-to-riches story remains one of the most retold legends of corporate India and is an inspiration to the youth of this nation. Born to a school teacher, he was the third of five siblings, three brothers and two sisters. His entrepreneurial career began in his early school years by selling "bhajias" to pilgrims in Mount Girnar over the weekends. On completion of his school studies, his brother Ramnikbhai sent him to Aden, Yemen; which was the second busiest oil banking and trading port of the time. Dhirubhai Ambani joined the largest transcontinental trading firm named A. Besse & Co as a gas-station attendant, as well as, a dispatch clerk. In 1958, he came back to India with Rs 50,000 and started the business of polyester yarn import-export at Masjid Bunder of South Mumbai and later found the Reliance Commercial Corporation with an investment of INR 15,000. A humble beginning helped him to stand his empire worth \$64 billion. A poll conducted by The Times of India in 2000 voted him "Greatest Creator of Wealth in the Centuries". He was named the "Man of 20th Century" by the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI). Founder and CEO of Gardner Rich & Co.




CHRIS GARDNER

Christopher Paul "Chris" Gardner (born February 9, 1954) is an American businessman, investor, stockbroker, motivational speaker, author, and philanthropist who, during the early 1980s, struggled with homelessness while raising his toddler son. Born without knowing his real father, he was driven out of his home by his abusive stepfather. He enlisted in the Navy and later became a medical supplies salesman. His travails of sleeping in a subway station bathroom, being homeless, passing the licensing exam for stockbrokers, and becoming employed by Bear Sterns was documented in his memoirs, "The Pursuit of Happiness". The 2006 motion picture 'The Pursuit of Happyness', starring Will Smith is based on the book. In 2012, just before his wife's death, she challenged him to find true happiness and fulfillment in the remainder of his life. He now travels all over the world 200 days a year as a motivational speaker and has spoken in over 50 countries.

15 Oct, 1931 - 27 July, 2015

11th President of India (2002-2007), Professor, Author and Aerospace Scientist



A.P.J. ABDUL KALAM

Avul Pakir Jainulabdeen Abdul Kalam, better known as A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, was born on 15th October 1931 and raised in Rameswaram, Tamil Nadu. In his early childhood, Kalam's family had become poor and so, at an early age, he sold newspapers to supplement his family's income. Despite all the drawbacks he faced in his life, he went on to study physics and aerospace engineering. He spent the next four decades as a scientist and science administrator, mainly at the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and Indian Space Research (ISRO) and was intimately involved in India's civilian space programme and military missile development efforts. He thus came to be known as the Missile Man of India for his work on the development of ballistic missiles and launch vehicle technology. He also played a pivotal organisational, technical, and political role in India's Pokhran-II nuclear tests in 1998, the first since the original nuclear test by India in 1974. Widely referred to as the "People's President,"he returned to his civilian life of education, writing and public service after a single term. He was the recipient of several prestigious awards including the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour. While delivering a lecture at the Indian Institute of Management Shillong, Kalam collapsed and died from an apparent cardiac arrest on 27 July 2015, aged 83.

Born 17 Sept, 1950 (66 Years)

14th Prime Minister of India (Incumbent), 14th Chief Minister of Gujarat (2001-2014)



NARENDRA MODI

Narendra Modi's journey began in the by-lanes of Vadnagar, a small and nondescript town in North Gujarat's Mehsana district. Born on 17th September 1950, three years after India attained freedom and within months of India becoming a Republic, Narendra Modi was the third of the six children of Damodardas Modi and Hiraba Modi. He completed his studies against all odds and his saga of struggle began when as a teenager, he, along with his brother, started running a tea stall near a railway station in Ahmedabad. He did his schooling from Vadnagar and obtained a master's degree in Political Science from Gujarat University. During his college days, he worked as a 'pracharak' (promoter) of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS). He left home at the age of 17 years and travelled across the country for the next two years. Modi was appointed chief minister of Gujarat in 2001, due to Keshubhai Patel's failing health and poor public image following the earthquake in Bhuj and was elected to the legislative assembly soon after. His policies as chief minister, credited with encouraging economic growth, have received praise, and several industrial projects were begun during his tenure. Modi was sworn in as the Prime Minister of India on 26 May 2014 at the Rashtrapati Bhavan. He became the first Prime Minister born after India's independence from the British rule.

Born 26th Aug, 1970 (46 Years)

CEO of Key Software Solutions



JYOTHI REDDY

Jyothi was the second of five children in a poor family. Due to her family's financial situation, she was admitted into a welfare orphanage. It was a heart breaking situation for Jyothi as she could not see her mother during the days when she was in the orphanage and had nobody to share her happiness and sorrow. However, instead of giving up hope, Jyothi developed a strong will to make her future bright. She attended a government school while at the orphanage and also took a vocational course. At the tender age of 16, Jyothi married her cousin and the situation became even worse as she had to work in the fields for a daily wage of Rs. 5 to take care of her children. These situations made her even stronger to stand and fight for life. She used to stitch petticoats at night to make more money. She studied computer courses to become eligible to work in the US and went there leaving her two daughters, in a missionary hostel. It was not an easy journey for her to settle in the US as she had to work in a gas station, work as a baby sitter, load/unload goods and work at a video shop for her survival. With her savings of \$40000, she opened an office in Phoenix in 2001 October. She has been successfully running her company KEYSS since then.

Born 26 August, 1953 (63 Years)

Former CEO Petrobras-Petroleo Brasil

GRACAS SILVA FOSTER

Maria das Graças Silva Foster ((born 26 August 1953), also known as Graça Foster, is a Brazilian business executive and chemical engineer. She was the CEO of Petrobras-Petróleo Brasil, Brazil's state-controlled oil company, which is located in Rio de Janeiro and was the first woman in the world to head a major oil-and-gas company. In April 2012, she was listed on the Times list of the 100 most influential people in the world. Born in the poverty-stricken Shantytown of Morro do Adeus, Brazil to an alcoholic father, she earned extra money by collecting cans and paper to continue her studies. By the time she was two years old, Foster's family moved from Caratinga to a favela, also known as a shanty town community, outside of Rio de Janeiro. The area, known as Complexo do Alemão, was extremely poverty stricken and ridden with crime. Overpopulation, drug trafficking, unsanitary conditions, malnutrition, pollution, and diseases, along with high mortality rates were widespread in the poorer favela communities. In order to pay for her school books, she often collected recyclable trash that had been dumped in the streets. She broke the barriers of the corporate ladder when she was hired as an intern at Petrobras, in 1978 and became the first female head of the department of engineering. Despite her national prominence and wealth, Foster continues to live in an apartment in Rio de Janeiro's Copacabana neighborhood, with her husband, British-born, Colin Foster, and her two adult children.

Born 28 Oct, 1955 (61 Years)

Chairperson & CEO of Pepsi Co.



INDRA NOOYI

Indra Krishnamurthy Nooyi (born 28 October 1955) is an American, business executive and the current Chairperson and Chief Executive Officer of PepsiCo, the second largest food and beverage business in the world by net revenue. Hers is a simple story of a powerful woman, an Indian girl who came from conservative Chennai to pursue higher studies in the US with little money and no safety net! If she failed, she failed. While studying in Connecticut, she worked as a receptionist from midnight to sunrise to earn money and struggled to put together US\$50 to buy herself a western suit for her first job interview out of Yale, where she had just completed her masters. Incidentally, she wasn't comfortable trying out a formal western outfit and ended up buying trousers that reached down only till her ankles. In 2006, Nooyi surpassed everybody's imagination, when she was named the successor to Steven Reinemund as chief executive officer of Pepsi Co. According to Business Week, since she started as CEO in 2000, the company's annual revenues have risen 72%, while net profit more than doubled, to USD 5.6 billion in 2006. She has been consistently ranked among the World's 100 Most Powerful Women. In 2014, she was ranked 13 in the list of Forbes World's 100 most powerful women and the 82nd most powerful woman in Fortune list 2016.

Born 20 Sept, 1958 (58 Years)

Chairman and CEO of Xerox Business and Technological Solution



URSULA BURNS

Ursula Burns grew up in a housing project in Manhattan's Lower East Side, a hub for gangs. She was raised by her Panamanian-immigrant single mother who ran a daycare center at her home and ironed shirts for a fee so that she could send Ursula to Cathedral High School. She earned her Mechanical Engineering degree at NYU and became an intern at Xerox. Burns first worked for Xerox as a summer intern, permanently joining a year later in 1981, after completing her master's degree. She worked in various roles in product development and planning in the remainder of the 1980s throughout her 20s. Ursula Burns went on to become the first African-American woman to ever lead a Fortune 500 Company and the 14th most powerful woman in the world. In addition to the Xerox board, she is a board director of the American Express Corporation, Exxon Mobil Corporation and Datto Inc. Burns also provides leadership counsel to community, educational and non-profit organizations. U.S. President Barack Obama appointed Burns to help lead the White House National program on STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics) in 2009 and in March 2010, appointed Burns as vice chair of the President's Export Council



Film Director and Actor



Michael Sylvester Gardenzio Stallone is an American actor, filmmaker, and screenwriter. He is well known for his Hollywood action roles, including boxer Rocky Balboa, the title character of the Rocky series' seven films from 1976 to 2015. Stallone's parents got divorced when Sylvester was nine, and he eventually lived with his mother. When Stallone was 16, he scored poorly in school and his mother got him a summer job at her beauty salon. His birth improper surgery also resulted in the paralysis of his face. As a result, the lower left side of his face is paralyzed – including parts of his lip, tongue, and chin – an accident which has given Stallone his snarling look and slightly slurred speech. In spite of all the odds, he was successful in becoming a famous American actor, filmmaker, and screenwriter. Stallone's film Rocky was inducted into the National Film Registry and the film props were placed in the Smithsonian Museum. Philadelphia has a statue of his Rocky character placed permanently near the museum. In 1977, Stallone was nominated for two Academy Awards for Rocky, Best Original Screenplay and Best Actor. He became the third man in history to receive these two nominations for the same film, after Charles Chaplin and Orson Welles His life story serves as a fitting example of the manner in which hard-work, enthusiasm and determination can help one overcome insurmountable odds.



Actor, Film Producer



LEONARDO DICAPRIO

Leonardo Wilhelm DiCaprio is an American actor and film producer. He began his career by appearing in television commercials in the early 1990s. In 1990, DiCaprio got his break on television when he was cast in the short-lived series based on the movie Parenthood. Leonardo DiCaprio had revealed in an interview to the 'Independent' that his upbringing was difficult and talked about being "very poor", as he defended his decision to play the amoral Jordan Belfort in Martin Scorsses's critically acclaimed "The Wolf of Wall Street". Before he became one of the most well respected actors in Hollywood, Leonardo DiCaprio was just a poor kid living in the mean streets of Los Angeles. In 1997, DiCaprio starred in James Cameron's Titanic as twenty-year-old Jack Dawson. The film went on to become the highest-grossing film, grossing \$1.843 billion in box office receipts worldwide. This movie transformed DiCaprio into a commercial movie superstar. His face appeared on the covers of many magazines and 3 books about him were among the top six paperbacks on "The New York Times" Best Seller List. Till date, he has won a number of awards including 2 Golden Globes for The Aviator and The Revenant. He also won a Hollywood Film Award in 2014 for his role in The Aviator.



Novelist



Joanne "Jo" Rowling, pen name J. K. Rowling, is a British novelist, screenwriter and film producer best known as the author of the Harry Potter fantasy series. The books have gained worldwide attention, won multiple awards, and sold more than 400 million copies. Born in Yates, Gloucestershire (England), Rowling was working as a researcher and bilingual secretary for Amnesty International when she conceived the idea for the Harry Potter series while on a delayed train from Manchester to London in 1990. The seven-year period that followed saw the death of her mother, birth of her first child, divorce from her first husband and relative poverty until she finished the first novel in the series, Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone, in 1997. Rowling has lived a "rags to riches" life story, in which she progressed from living on state benefits to multi-millionaire status within five years. She is the United Kingdom's best-selling living author, with sales in excess of £238M. In October 2010, Rowling was named the "Most Influential Woman in Britain" by leading magazine editors. She has also supported charities including Comic Relief, One Parent Families, Multiple Sclerosis Society of Great Britain and Lumos (formerly the Children's High Level Group).




OPRAH WINFREY

Oprah Gail Winfrey (born Orpah Gail Winfrey; January 29, 1954) is an American media proprietor, talk show host, actress, producer, and philanthropist. She is best known for her talk show The Oprah Winfrey Show, which was the highest-rated television program of its kind in history and was nationally syndicated from 1986 to 2011. Dubbed the "Queen of All Media", she has been ranked the richest African-American, the greatest black philanthropist in American history, and is currently North America's first and only multi-billionaire black person. Winfrey was born into poverty in rural Mississippi to a teenage single mother and later raised in an inner-city Milwaukee neighborhood. She has stated that she was molested during her childhood and early teens and became pregnant at 14; her son died in infancy. Sent to live with the man she calls her father, a barber in Tennessee, Winfrey landed a job in radio while still in high school and began co-anchoring the local evening news at the age of 19. Her emotional ad-lib delivery eventually got her transferred to the daytime-talk-show arena, and after boosting a third-rated local Chicago talk show to first place, she launched her own production company. Credited with creating a more intimate confessional form of media communication, she is thought to have popularized and revolutionized the tabloid talk show genre pioneered by Phil Donahue, which a Yale study says broke 20th-century taboos and allowed minorities to enter the mainstream. By the mid-1990s, she had reinvented her show with a focus on literature, self-improvement, and spirituality.



SAM WALTON

Samuel Moore Walton was born to Thomas Gibson Walton and Nancy Lee, in Kingfisher, Oklahoma. He lived there with his parents on their farm until 1923. Growing up during the Great Depression, he did chores to help make financial ends meet for his family as was common at the time. He milked the family cow, bottled the surplus, and drove it to customers. Afterwards, he would deliver Columbia Daily Tribune newspapers on a paper route. In addition, he sold magazine subscriptions. He joined JC Penny three days after graduating from the University of Missouri with a BA Economics degree. Soon afterwards, Walton joined the military in the U.S. Army Intelligence Corps, supervising security at aircraft plants and prisoner of war camps. In 1945, after leaving the military, Walton took over management of his first variety store at the age of 26. With the help of a \$20,000 loan from his father-in-law, plus \$5,000 he had saved from his time in the Army, Walton purchased a Ben Franklin variety store in Newport, Arkansas. He expanded the store into the retailer giant Walmart and the membership-only retailer warehouse Sam's Club. Walton died on Sunday, April 5, 1992, of multiple myeloma, a type of blood cancer, in Little Rock, Arkansas. At the time, his company employed 380,000 people. Annual sales of nearly \$50 billion flowed from 1,735 Wal-Marts, 212 Sam's Clubs, and 13 Supercenters




INGVAR KAMPRAD

Living on a farm most of his growing up years, this Swedish business magnate had always been known for being enterprising, even at a young age, as he bought matches in bulk and sold them individually to his neighbors. This expanded to fish, pens and Christmas decorations. He also used the cash reward that his father gave him for good grades and used this to create a mail-order business that became the retail company IKEA. Furniture became the company's biggest seller, which made him one of the richest men in the world today having a net worth of \$3 billion.

IKEA was founded in 1943 at Kamprad's uncle Ernst's kitchen table. He lived in Épalinges, Switzerland, from 1976 to 2014. According to an interview with TSR, Kamprad drives a 1993 Volvo 240, flies only economy class, and encourages IKEA employees to use both sides of pieces of paper. The company he created is still known for the attention it gives to cost control, operational details and continuous product development, allowing it to lower its prices by an average of 2-3% over the decade to 2010, while continuing its global expansion. In June 2013, Kamprad resigned from the board of Inter IKEA Holding SA and his youngest son Mathias Kamprad replaced Per Ludvigsson as the chairman of the holding company.

Born 17 Jan, 1962 (55 Years)

Actor, Stand Up Comedian and Screen Writer




JIM CARREY

James Eugene Carrey was born in Ontario, Canada to a middle-income family where his musician father worked as an accountant. However, things got worse for his family when his father lost his job and they all had to move to Scarborough. He worked at the Titan Wheels Factory for eight hours a day while attending school, but never finished high school. While living in a camper van, he started doing stand-up routines and eventually landed a gig in the sitcom 'The Duck Factory'. His family's financial struggles made it difficult for them to support Carrey's ambitions. He first gained recognition in 1990 when he became one of the casts in the sketch comedy 'In Living Colors'. He later moved on to movies and became one of the highest paid comedians in America. Carrey has also battled depression, to deal with which he took Prozac and eventually deciding to get off medications. He has stated that he no longer takes medications or stimulants of any kind, not even coffee. It hasn't been an easy year for Jim Carrey in 2016, as his girlfriend Catriona White was found dead in her home after taking her own life on September 28, 2015. Yet despite everything, the actor has managed to dive headfirst into two projects. First up is True Crimes, a thriller that is set to hit screens at some point in 2016 and the second is The Bad Batch, also hitting cinemas on an undetermined date in 2016.

8 July, 1839 - 23 May, 1937

Founder of the Rockefeller Foundation, Rockefeller University & Standard Oil Company



JOHN D. ROCKEFELLER

Rockefeller was the second of six children and eldest son born in Richford, New York, to con artist William Avery "Bill" Rockefeller. Bill was first a lumberman and then a traveling salesman who identified himself as a "botanic physician" and sold elixirs. John did his share of the regular household chores and earned extra money raising turkeys, selling potatoes and candy, and eventually lending small sums of money to neighbors. Despite his father's absences and frequent family moves, young John was a well-behaved, serious, and studious boy. His contemporaries described him as reserved, earnest, religious, methodical, and discreet. He was an excellent debater and expressed himself precisely. He might have inherited his good business sense from his father, a traveling salesman who used all the tricks to get out of decent hard work and taught his son to always get the best deal in all things. His mom struggled to raise them and though they moved a number of times, he was able to finish school and get his first job as a bookkeeper where he earned \$50 in three months. He decided to put up a firm and built an oil refinery with his friend Maurice B. Clark in 1859. He later bought out the Clark brothers' refinery firm and renamed it Rockefeller & Andrews. He also found the Standard Oil Company to become the world's first billionaire and the richest person in history.



Chairman and CEO of Starbucks (Jan 8, 2008 to 3 April, 2017)



HOWARD SCHULTZ

Howard Schultz came from a poor family living in the Canarsie Bayview Houses, a housing project in Brooklyn, New York, which made him want to have a lifestyle beyond what his truckdriver father can provide. As he saw escape in sport, he became a football scholar at the University of North Michigan, where he graduated with a degree in communication. While working for Xerox, he discovered a small coffee shop called Starbucks and became captivated by it. He left Xerox and became the first CEO of Starbucks in 1987, which he expanded from its first 60 shops to over 16,000 outlets worldwide, giving him a net worth of \$1.5 billion. Schultz decided to leave Starbucks in 1985 in order to open his first store, "Il Giornale", named after the Milanese newspaper of the same name. The store offered ice cream in addition to coffee, had little seating and played opera music in the background to portray an Italian experience. Two years later, the original Starbucks management decided to focus on Peet's Coffee & Tea and sold its Starbucks retail unit to Schultz and Il Giornale for US\$3.8 million. Schultz renamed Il Giornale with the Starbucks name and aggressively expanded its reach across the United States. On January 8, 2008 Schultz returned as CEO of Starbucks after an eight-year hiatus. At this time, Schultz was earning a total compensation of \$9,740,471, which included a base salary of \$1,190,000, and options granted of \$7,786,105. On the first of November 2013, it was announced that Schultz had stepped down from the board of Square, to be replaced by former Goldman Sachs executive David Viniar.

Born 2 Sept, 1959 (57 Years)

Founder of Cirque du Soleil



GUY LALIBERTÉ

Laliberté was born in 1959 in Quebec City, Quebec, Canada. His interest in show business began at a relatively young age. His parents took him to watch the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus, an experience which led Laliberté to read the biography of P. T. Barnum. While he was still in school, Guy produced several performing arts events. After school, he entered the world of street performance, playing the harmonica and accordion on the streets of Quebec. Laliberté joined a performing troupe called Les Échassiers, which included fire-breathers, jugglers, and acrobats who hitched around the country from show to show. Guy Laliberté co-founded Quebec's first internationally renowned circus with Gilles Ste-Croix and a small group of colleagues. He recognized and cultivated the talents of the buskers from the Fête foraine de Baie-Saint-Paul and created 'Cirque du Soleil' in 1984 with the support of a government grant for the celebration of the 450th anniversary of Jacques Cartier's discovery of Canada. 'Cirque du Soleil' was originally set up as a one-year project. However, the government of Quebec wanted a touring event that would perform in other provinces. The name 'Cirque du Soleil' ("circus of the sun"), reflects his notion that "the sun stands for energy and youth" and he now commands a total net worth of \$2.5 billion.
