People are usually trained to think about their work in a logical, left-brained manner. Even though logic is vital to the thinking process, you can vastly expand your understanding by learning to take a wider view of your work lives. This includes projects that one is involved in, the contribution one makes, coworkers, salary, vacation days, benefit packages - all of which are thought of from a right brain perspective, which in turn helps one to understand how a given job will fit into the overall pattern of life, now and through time.

To comprehend this further, think of the time you are deciding how to approach the boss about a new idea. Do you feel a thrill whenever you have that idea in your head and want to share it? These obviously positive feelings convey that your intuition is saying, 'Yes!' A negative response might be a feeling of heaviness, or of being stuck. This type of response, which you should pay attention to, is your intuition saying, 'No way!'.

The most successful inventors, business people, scientists and those in any other field of endeavour become successful because they have learned to trust their inner voice. The objective is to approach a decision by listening to your inner voice. It is important for you to step back and take a hard look at aspects like: How will the decision you are making affect you, your family, your long-term goals, your spiritual side, and your health?

Once you review all these aspects in relation to each other, you can see their interconnectedness and learn to rely on your intuition.

With each step you take, ask yourself, both logically and intuitively, how it affects your health, your well-being, your environment. If you sense adverse effects, step back and come up with a different approach and live a happier, healthier life.
