She told the tortoise to latch on her stubby tail so that he would not sink. Then, the hare climbed on to the floating shell of the tortoise. The penguin paddled across the pond with her head held up.

After crossing the water, the three animals looked gratefully at one another. Then they set off again towards the distant lighthouse.

Soon the three came to a wall. The tortoise could not imagine how he would get over the wall. Even the penguin was too short to hop over the wall.
